# First Stake in Angola Organized



The Church organized its first stake in Angola in late 2018 in Luanda with six wards and six branches. The Angola Luanda Mission was organized in 2013 and currently has few missionaries assigned to serve within its boundaries primarily due to high living costs. The Church organized its first branch in

Angola in 1996 and assigned the first full-time missionaries to serve in the country in 2008. Rapid membership growth has occurred as annual membership growth rates have exceeded 10% since 2009.

# Congregational Growth Rates in the United States Improve in 2018 Compared to 2017



The Church in the United States has reported a net increase of approximately 50 wards and branches during 2018.

Although less than typical years during the past couple decades, this increase in congregations is significantly more than what occurred in 2017 when there was no net change in the number of wards and branches. There are approximately 14,275 wards and branches in the United States. Historically, the Church in the United States has reported a net increase of 100-200 congregations a year during the past two decades.

# Rapid Congregational Growth in the DR Congo

in The Church the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DR Congo) has reported a net increase of 15 wards and branches thus far in 2018. As a result. 2018 has tied with 2014 for the year with the second largest increase in the number of congregations in a single year after 2010 when there was a net increase of 16 wards and



branches. The Church has very cautiously expanded into a few select areas of the country since its initial establishment in the mid-1980s. Nevertheless, rapid growth has occurred in most locations where a Church presence has been officially established. There are now 196 wards and branches in the DR Congo. The Church reached 100 wards and branches in the country in 2011.

## **Growth Developments in Nigeria**

There has been a net increase of at least 48 wards and branches in Nigeria thus far in 2018. The Church reported a net increase of 101 wards and branches in 2017 – an increase of more than 20% even though membership grew by 7.1%. A significant number of new wards/branches organized



in 2018 suggests continued growth, especially after the unprecedented number of new ward/branch creations reported in 2017. The Church in Nigeria also continues to expand outreach. For example, in Osun State the city of Ikire recently had its first branch organized under the Nigeria Ibadan Mission. Ikire appears to have more than 200,000 inhabitants and was one of the most populous cities in southwestern Nigeria without a Church presence.

### **New Stake Created in Laredo, Texas**

The Church organized its first stake in Laredo, Texas last Sunday. Prior to the creation of the new stake, the Laredo Texas District was one seven remaining districts in the United States. There are now 75 stakes and two districts in Texas.

### **New Ward in Botswana**



The Church organized a new ward in the Gaborone metropolitan area during December. The Mogoditshane Ward was organized in the northwestern part of the city and is the fifth ward to operate in Gaborone. The Church in Botswana has significant reported fluctuations in growth trends

since its establishment in the early 1990s. Most recently, the Church in Botswana has reported slow growth which has appeared primarily due to shortages of full-time missionaries serving in the country. These missionary shortages have been due to visa problems with the government. The Church reported 3,376 members and 14 official congregations at year-end 2017. The Church organized its first mission in Botswana in 2012 although this mission has been headquartered in Pretoria, South Africa for many years due to visa problems with the Botswanan government.

## First Branch Organized in Rural Uganda

The Church organized its first branch in rural Uganda during the past month. The Kamonkali Branch was organized from a member group that began to function in a rural community west of Mbale called Mile 5. This member group was officially organized in March 2018 with 175 in attendance. Missionaries reported 80-90



who consistently attended church prior to the organization of the new branch. There are many opportunities for expansion into rural areas in Uganda where three-quarters of the national population of 41 million resides.
