First Asian American and Latin American Apostles Called

The Church announced on March 31st, 2018 that Elder Gerrit W. Gong and Elder Ulisses Soares were called as new apostles in the Quorum of the Twelve. Elder Gong is the first Asian American to be called into the Quorum of the Twelve as Elder Gong's family originally immigrated to the United States from southern China. Elder Soares is the first Latin American to be called into the Quorum of the Twelve. Elder Soares is a native of São Paulo, Brazil. This development signals a significant step in the internationalization of the Church as the Quorum of the Twelve has historically comprised only of Europeans and North Americans.

2017 Statistical Report Released

The Church reported the following statistics as of December 31st, 2017.

- Membership: 16,118,169 (increase of 235,752 from 2016; a 1.48% annual increase)
- Congregations: 30,306 (increase of 202 from 2016; a 0.67% annual increase)
- Stakes: 3,341 (increase of 75 from 2016; a 2.3% annual increase)
- Districts: 553 (decrease of 3 from 2016; a 0.54% annual decrease)
- Missions: 421 (decrease of 1 from 2016; a 0.24% annual decrease)
- Convert Baptisms: 233,729 (decrease of 6,402 from 2016; a 2.74% annual decrease)

- Increase of Children on Record: 106,771 (decrease of 2,475 from 2016; a 2.27% annual decrease)
- Full-time missionaries: 67,049 (decrease of 3,897 from 2016; a 5.49% annual decrease)
- Church service missionaries: 33,965 (increase of 2,207 from 2016; a 6.50% annual increase)

Milestone of 2,100 Congregations (Wards and Branches) Reached in Brazil

The Church in Brazil reached the milestone of 2,100 official congregations (e.g. wards and branches) in late March 2018. With the exception of the United States, no



other country has reached this milestone before. The Church in Brazil reached milestone of congregations in the early 1990s, 1,500 congregations in the late 1990s. congregations in 2004, 1,900 congregations in 2010, and 2,000 congregations in 2015. The Church in Mexico was the

first country, with the exception of the United States, to reach 2,000 congregations for the first time in 2009. However, the Church in Mexico has experienced essentially stagnant congregational growth since this time and currently reports approximately 1,987 congregations due to member inactivity and local leadership challenges.

New Branch in Nicaragua

Earlier this month, the Church in Nicaragua organized a new branch in Somotillo. With approximately 18,000 inhabitants, Somotillo was previously the fourth most populous city in Nicaragua without an official LDS ward or branch. The Church has steadily opened new branches in

previously unreached cities and towns Nicaragua during the past decade, particularly locations nearby the most populous cities such as Chinandega. Managua. León, and Masaya. There now congregations (73 wards, 39 branches) Nicaragua.



Elder Stevenson Visits Burma (Myanmar)

Missionaries in Burma report that 176 people attended a recent meeting with apostle Elder Stevenson in Yangon. Missionaries from the Thialand Bangkok Mission have served in Burma since early 2014. Missionaries in the past couple years have indicatd plans to organize additional branches in Yangon although currently only one branch operates in the city of 5.4 million. It is unclear why the Church has not yet organized additional branches in the city or opened additional cities to proselytism. Currently the



Church is translating the Book of Mormon, the Doctrine and Covenants, and the Pearl of Great Prince into Burmese.

LDS Developments in Mumbai, India

Missionaries serving in the India New Delhi Mission report several significant developments in Mumbai. The number of missionaries assigned to the city has doubled from 6 to 12, non-Indian missionaries have been assigned for the first time, and there are plans to organize a second branch in



the foreseeable future. Mumbai first opened to missionary work in 2012. With 24.2 million inhabitants, Mumbai is currently the most populous metropolitan area in the world with only one official LDS congregation.

Branch Reinstated in Angola

The Church in Angola reinstated the Huambo Branch in late February. Originally organized in May 2013, the branch closed in late 2015 and reverted back to a member group due to concerns with leadership development and its isolated location. The Huambo Branch currently has a full branch presidency led by local



branch presidency led by local leaders. There are now three cities in Angola with an official branch: Luanda (11), Huambo (1), and Lubango (1). The Angola Luanda Mission was organized in 2013 and currently has few missionaries assigned to serve within its boundaries. The lack of missionaries serving in the mission has appeared primarily due to high living costs.

LDS Growth Accelerates in Uganda

Several significant growth developments have recently occurred in Uganda such as the organization of new branches and a new member group. The Church organized its third branch in Busia - a city located on the Uganda-Kenya border. Additionally, second branch was created in Masaka and there are plans



to create a third branch in the city in the near future. Also, a new member group on the outskirts of Mbale was recently created in the town of Kabwangasi. Other cities have also experienced significant increases in the number of members attending church in the past 12 months. Surprisingly, the removal of full-time missionaries from cities outside of the Kampala and Jinja area 1-2 years ago has appeared to be the primary catalyst for this acceleration in growth as local leaders have had to undertake missionary responsibilities themselves. Missionaries have returned to many of these cities once a sustained need for their assistance to teach and baptize new converts was established.

Good Convert Retention and Rapid Membership Growth Continue in Cote d'Ivoire



Several recently returned missionaries who served in Cote d'Ivoire report that convert retention rates have recently ranged from 50-80% for the two Ivorian missions. This is a significant accomplishment as both missions appear to baptize more than 2,000 converts annually. Missionaries currently serving in Cote

d'Ivoire report that some missionaries baptize more than 100 converts during their missions and that many, if not most, wards and branches hold convert baptismal services on a weekly basis. Furthermore, missionaries serving in the Cote d'Ivoire Abidjan West Mission project that the mission will baptize 2,000 new converts within the first five months of 2018.

New Branch Created in Iceland



The Church created a new branch in Iceland for the first time in many vears. The new branch is the Akureyri Branch. Missionaries report as many as 25 people attending church services a significant increase form the 4 members in the member group when it was organized and missionaries were

assigned in late 2015. Akureyri once had full-time missionaries assigned in the late twentieth century although proselytism efforts appeared largely unsuccessful, resulting in the closure of the city to missionary work by the late 1990s. Although there are fewer than 300 members in the entire country, the vast majority of them self-affiliate on the census as Latter-Day Saint. In contrast, most countries that collect religious data on their citizens report fewer than 50% of LDS-reported numbers.
