New Stake on Panay Island, Philippines

The Church created its fifth stake on Panay Island in the Philippines. The Iloilo Philippines Central Stake was divided from the Iloilo Philippines North Stake—a stake which has not divided since it was organized in 1997. In 2001, there were only four wards and five branches in the Iloilo Philippines North Stake, and much of the growth that has resulted in the creation of the new stake has come from branches becoming wards. The new stake brings the total number of stakes in the Philippines to 126. With three stakes in Iloilo City, prospects



appear favorable for the announcement of a small temple one day. However, growth on Panay island has been slow for most of the Church's history. The first branch on Panay Island was organized in Iloilo city in 1969. Most cities and towns with an official ward or branch had their first Latterday Saint congregations organized in the 1990s.

New Branch in the DR Congo in Previously Unreached City



The Church organized its first branch in the Congolese city of Kimpese. The new branch pertains to the Matadi DR Congo District which now has seven branches. Significant progress has recently occurred in the far western areas of the DR Congo bordering the Atlantic Ocean. Of the four

cities with official branches in the region, three of these cities have had the first branches created since 2018. The first branch in this area of the country was organized in Matadi in 2010. There are now 24 cities, towns, and villages in the DR Congo with an official ward or branch.
